Women's earnings compared to men over a lifetime – The Guardian

Women in Australia earn \$1m less on average over their lifetimes than men and retire with \$136,000 less in superannuation, according to research released on International Women's Day.

Research indicates the biggest driver of the gap in retirement savings is still the gender pay gap. It found that women earning the median wage would accumulate about \$393,676 in super, \$151,000 below the level defined as a "comfortable retirement" by the Association of Superannuation Funds of Australia.

The research adds to growing calls to pay more parental leave to both parents and pay superannuation on paid parental leave.

The Centre for Future Work report's other recommendations are for greater family-friendly work practices and access to free or more affordable earlier childhood education and care, because lower participation among women and part-time work to balance work and care also drive lower retirement savings.
