On 21/10/23, several Redcliffe Zontians and many residents of The Village joined together to make light work of assembling 400 Birthing Kits. Petra organized a short video of the assembly process on the large TV in the Community Centre. We provided a lovely morning tea as thanks for those who assisted. A certificate of appreciation was also created by June to place on the Village Noticeboard.

On the 26/10/23, Dawn, Cheryl and I attended the "Get to Know your New AO" at Bunnings Rothwell. There were approx. 50 representatives, from Groups that Bunnings Rothwell supports via Sausage Sizzles, Raffles, Stalls and

Moreton Bay Regional Homelessness Forum

Cheryl Livock attended the **Moreton Bay Regional Homelessness Forum** which was hosted by <u>Q Shelter</u> and <u>Encircle</u> <u>Community Services</u> on 3 November. The purpose of the forum was to bring a together a range of support workers from community and governmental organisations to develop an action plan that would address local housing and homelessness issues. Some of these groups included:


- Chameleon Housing provides youth housing on the Redcliffe peninsular for youth aged between 15 and 25.
- Kyabra provides training and enables access for all social and ethnic groups to necessary social services, including NDIS, foster and kinship care, housing support services, family, children and parenting support, support for those enduring domestic violence.
- Church groups the Salvation Army, CMS (Church Missionary Society)
- *Qld government agencies* HSC (Housing Service Centres department of housing), Community Health Programs (Department of Health)

Participants rotated around 6 tables contributing to views on table topics regarding issues related to homelessness: the workforce, practice, blue sky thinking, smoothing barriers to connecting government and community organisations, developing collaboration hubs (stand alone, at shopping centres, libraries, pop up hubs at parks, virtual), sharing data and developing strong accountability frameworks similar to hospital data access. A <u>directory of services</u> will be updated on the Morton Bay council site. It was great to see so many organisations focussed on this growing issue of homelessness coming up with a number of practical ways to tackle this issue.
